United for a Fair Economy is a national, nonpartisan, nonprofit, organization that raises public awareness of the dangers of growing economic inequality in America, with a view that concentrated wealth undermines and corrupts democracy, deepens the economic divide, widens racial divisions, and tears apart our social fabric. Founded as a "movement support" organization in 1995, it provides information and analysis infused with common sense and humor that demystifies the economy, and inspires people from all walks of life to take action to change the rules.

United for a Fair Economy has been the single, most effective group in the country for publicizing issues of growing economic inequality, income and wealth disparities, and the persistent economic gap between whites and people of color. Under Meizhu's leadership, UFE has honed its messages and broadened its reach, tapping into the concerns of grassroots constituencies, including those who do not speak English as their first language.

Meizhu was a Boston City Hospital kitchen worker for 20 years, rising from the ranks to become President of AFSCME Local 1489. The local tackled tough issues like maintaining affirmative action gains during lay-offs. In 1993 Meizhu became an organizer for Health Care For AII, building a multi-ethnic coalition that challenged Boston's hospitals to fund community driven health projects.

Meizhu served on the Center for American Progress' National Initiative to End Poverty. She is a Trustee of the Hyams Foundation in Boston. Her work has been honored by the YWCA, the Immigrant Workers' Resource Center, Mass Senior Action Council, and the Boston Women's Fund, among others. She is a long-time member of Freedom Road Socialist Organization, a national organization well known for its participation in struggles for fundamental social change, against racism, and for a strong left.
